Quick Reference

Children need safe and healthy homes for optimal growth and development physically, emotionally and developmentally. Safe and healthy homes put children at lower risk for injuries or illness.

What can family support professionals do to help families?

- Complete a safety checklist with families – check with your supervisor for program guidelines and tools.
- Parent education provide education and resource materials to all families.
- Make referrals and connect families with local resources.

Fire Safety

- 🖊 Replace smoke detector batteries every six months
- 4 Avoid smoking in the house and always extinguish tobaccoproducts properly.
- Keep matches and lighters away from children.
- 🖊 Have a plan and practice, practice, practice.

Inform parents that supervision is the best way to prevent accidents.
