Virginia-Specific Resources for Helping Families Access Oral Health Care

- <u>Virginia 2-1-1</u> Provides up-to-date listings of dental clinics, searchable by zip code and details services provided as well as information related to sliding fee scales.
- <u>Cover Virginia</u>, Connecting Virginians to Affordable Health Insurance Virginia Medicaid and FAMIS programs offer comprehensive dental benefits for children and pregnant women. Pregnant women are covered during pregnancy through 60 days postpartum. Additionally, some Medicaid health plans offer limited, enhanced dental benefits to enrolled adults.
